




# <u>Pedro's Yo-Yos: How a Filipino Immigrant Came to America and Changed the World of Toys</u>

Themes: Fiction | Humor | Fantasy

- If you have a physical copy of the book, be sure to peek underneath the cover.

- Introduce the author by exploring the resources on his author page.
- View Collier's Meet-the-Author Movie. What does he say about his artwork?
- Choose one of his <u>titles</u> to share with your readers. Encourage them to create their own collage artwork.
