




My Antarctica: True Adventures in the Land of Mummified Seals, Space Robots, and So Much More

Themes: Nonfiction | Science | Geography

- Build background knowledge by exploring the Virtual Book Tour.
- Listen to Neri's Meet-the-Author Recording about creating My Antarctica.
- Invite students to identify 3 things they learned about the author's research experiences.
- Pair observation and writing skills by inviting students to enjoy Neri's <u>Imagination Activity</u>, describing their own town through the eyes of a stranger.



The Bridge Home

Themes: Realistic Fiction | South Asian | Homelessness

- Access writing prompts and discussion ideas with this guide.
- Meet the author by listening to her <u>Audio Name Pronunciation</u>. Have your students write and record their own audio name pronunciation.
- Discover how the author's own life influenced her writing with this <u>Meet-the-Author</u> <u>Recording</u>.
- Listen to the audiobook excerpt read by the author.

Author Study Ideas

- Listen to the author's <u>Audio Name Pronunciation</u>. What tricks does she give to remember how to say her name?
- Play the <u>Meet-the-Author Recording</u> for Smile. Ask students to make a list of personal experiences they might use to write a story.
- Demonstrate browsing all <u>books by the author</u>, then filter by resource type, such as book trailers or book previews, to find a new book to read.
- Use the share tool to create a shelf card for the <u>author</u>, adding to book baskets, displays, or shelves.
