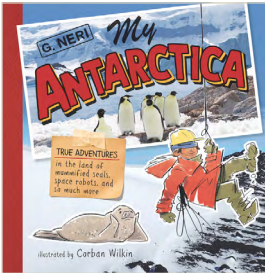

Book Ideas

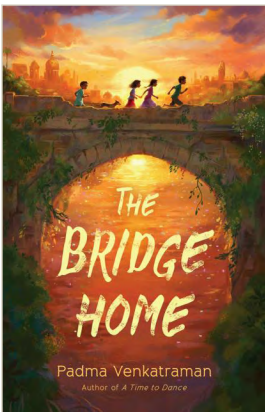


My Antarctica: True Adventures in the Land of Mummified Seals, Space Robots, and So Much More

- Demonstrate browsing all [books by the author](#), then filter by resource type, such as book trailers or book previews, to find a new book to read.
